
The urban environment of Kumbo town is not conducive to those who live in or visit Kumbo. This environment is characterized by the following undesirable effects: -






Problem Tree N° 1: Existing State of Development of Kumbo town




Problem Tree N° 2: Unstructured and Unorganized Land Use Patterns






Problem Tree N° 4: Incoherent and Degraded Urban Road Networks and Infrastructure










Problem Tree N° 8: Absence of an Organized System of Storm Drainage










Problem Tree N° 12: Inadequate and Poor Housing Conditions




Problem Tree N° 13: Entrenching Environmental Degradation




Problem Tree N° 14: Weak and Unstable Economic Base

The ultimate planning goal for Kumbo is to make Kumbo a conducive environment for its citizens and visitors by ensuring the following expected outcomes:


- Ensuring a healthy living environment for all citizens and visitors;

Launching Ceremony of the Kumbo town land use Plan (L.U.P)

SPEECH OF SDO BUI

It is for me a real honor to preside over this ceremony of the official launching of the preparation of a Land Use plan for Kumbo Town.

The Mayor of Kumbo Council in collaboration with the Minister of Housing and Urban Development has made possible conditions for the organization of the Kumbo Town to avoid the anarchical occupation of space in future.

The Consultants in charge of this project are here to ensure that Kumbo Town benefits from this opportunity. In fact, Kumbo as the head quarter of Bui has a great chance to have a Land Use Plan. Out of 300 towns in Cameroon, less than 40 have town plans and less than 20 have approved town plans.

While the populations of Kumbo deserve this particular attention of the Government to improve on their living and working conditions, they should in turn support the effort of the Government contributing to putting in place the envisaged planning process:

First of all, field studies home already been carried out through the whole town and its environs and you might have been asked to respond to certain questions concerning yourself, your family, your activities and your pre-occupations in relation to the development of Kumbo.

Again, the Land Use Plan project shall be followed up by technical pilot Committee presented our by the Prefect of Bui;

This Land Use Plan shall be completed by zoning regulation to make it legally binding on all. That is to say that there shall be land use regulation to be respect by all parties in the development and management of Kumbo Town.

In effect, land use planning is a process of organizing the future pattern and intensity of the use of land which enables the orderly organization of housings, infrastructures and basic public and community facilities.

The putting in place of better conditions for the development of Kumbo requires the participation of everybody. I am requesting all the local actors to be interested in this project and to make their contributions within the participatory process to be put in place

While wishing the consultant and his team successful field work and planning, I hope all sons, daughters and sympathizers of Kumbo shall join to ensure the success of this project.

I officially declared lunched work on the preparation of Kumbo Land Use Plan

SPEECH OF THE MAYOR OF KUMBO COUNCIL

On my behalf and the population of Kumbo in particular and Bui in general, we deeply appreciate the efforts of the government through what the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development has done and still intends to do to improve upon the planning and development of Kumbo, the heart of Bui division.

You know as well as I do that Kumbo is a very difficult site to plan and develop. The development of Kumbo has largely been spontaneous, hapharsard and characterized among others by:

- The absence of a coherent road network which is safe, convenient and save residents time and money to move from one place to another;
- The inadequate supply of basic urban services and facilities accessible to most of the population;
- The inadequate supply of regular and reliable energy for socio economic production;
- Spontaneous and hapharsard land development and construction due to the lack of properly laid out land provided with basic services and amenities;
- ❖ Absence of a coherent drainage and sewage disposal system.

I hope this initiative to prepare a Land Use Plan for the town of Kumbo by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development is not only timely but shall also open a wide window of opportunities for this ministry, other Ministries and other development partners to alleviate the poverty of the people of Kumbo in particular and Bui in general and create conditions for the durable and sustainable development of Kumbo.

Appendix n°4: Report of the launching ceremony

INTRODUCTION

The launching ceremony of the Kumbo Town land use Plan (L.U.P) took place at the Kumbo Town Council hall. The said ceremony began at about 11:15 am till about 05:30 pm.

LAUNCHING PROGRAM: (see the appendices)

- Arrival of the population;
- Arrival of Traditional and Administrative Authorities;
- Arrival of Senior Divisional of Meme Division;
- Singing of the Cameroon National Anthem;
- Prayer;
- Speech from the Divisional Delegate of MINHDU;
- Welcome speech by the Mayor of Kumbo Council;
- Speech by the Director General of BATISU SARL;
- Technical presentation by the chief of mission;
- Launching address by the SDO, Bui.

The official launching ceremony of the Kumbo Town Land use Plan, presided over by the Senior Divisional Officer of Bui Division took place on 2nd day of November 2012. The ceremony began with the singing of the Cameroon Anthem, followed by a word of prayer.

The Divisional Delegate of MINHDU, Bui, presented the launching program and the Director General of BATISU Sarl, Yaoundé, the consulting firm which has been awarded the contract for the preparation of Kumbo Town Land use Plan. He explained that the project is financed by MINHDU and the consultant was selected by Public Tender by the SDO for Bui.

The Mayor of Kumbo Town Council welcomed everyone who was present at the ceremony. He expressed joy of the Town Council and the people of Kumbo that at last the preparation of the Land use Plan of Kumbo Town, which was being awaited since is in effect started. He emphasized on the fact there is a Prefectoral order restricting all constructions throughout the whole town till the elaboration of the Land use plan is over. He asked the population of Kumbo to collaborate with the consultants and any other party to ensure that this project is well done.

The General Manager of BATISU-SARL expressed his joy for having been given the task to prepare the Land use Plan of Kumbo Town. He gave the floor to the Chief of Mission to explain the technical aspect of the project to participants.

The Chief of Mission explained the main reasons of a Land use Plan (LUP), the project methodology, the consulting team and the program for the different workshops which shall follow the launching ceremony.

The SDO began by appreciating the fact that it was an honor for him to preside over the official launching ceremony of the preparation of the Kumbo Land use Plan (LUP). One of the outstanding statements highlighted here was that of the necessity of a land use Plan which was to guide the town and also to avoid the anarchical occupation of the urban space of Kumbo. He also made mention of the fact that the consultant was in Kumbo to carry out the study and people of Kumbo should make use of this wonderful opportunity. He reminded the general assembly that out of the 300 towns in Cameroon, less than 40 have towns and less than 20 have plans that have been approved. The main aim of the

Landuse plan was to improve upon the living conditions of the inhabitants of the Town of Kumbo. He invited all the various urban actors to collaborate with the planning team to enable them carry out their study without any difficulties. He finally declared the preparation of Kumbo Town Land use plan officially launched.

The launching ceremony ended with refreshments.
